ARE YOU INTERESTED IN CURBSIDE RECYCLING SURVEY? (this is not a vote)

A suggestion by a North Ridge homeowner, Helen Graffy, prompted the board to look into alternative trash collection companies that offered curbside recycling. Here is what we found out:

Industrial Disposal offers the following...

- Weekly trash pick-up for a monthly charge of \$12.30 (cart provided)
- Bi-Weekly curbside recycling for a monthly charge of \$4.50 (cart provided)
- Must call in for large items to be picked up (1 item per week)
- Yard waste must be in 4' x 6" bundles Per Industrial Disposal, we can't have recycling pick-up without trash pick-up.

A message from Helen Graffy:

"How much of your garbage can be recycled? I challenge you to look! You might be surprised. Even though our kids

are grown and gone, David and I still manage to produce as much recyclables as we do garbage. Mind you, up till now recycling meant going to Buckner and dropping off bags of cans, bottles, cardboard, newspaper etc. into dirty, smelly, bee-infested bins. And guess what, lots of people do that. Maybe you do it too. Consider how much better it would be if we could put the recyclables out curbside for pick-up.

Please consider recycling to be a conscious choice to do the right thing. Just for starters: recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a 100-watt bulb for 20 hours, a computer for 3 hours or a TV for 2 hours (EPA 2008). Glass never wears out and can be recycled forever. Each of us uses approximately one 100-foot tall Douglas fir tree in paper and wood products per year (EPA 2008). Please take the time to give this your attention. Think of this as an invitation to join your neighbors in doing the right thing."
